DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY/ GREEN CLUB HANDS ON TRAINING ON VERMICOMPOSTING

The Green Club and Department of Botany at St. Joseph University (SJU), Chumoukedima, organized a one-day hands-on training program on vermicomposting on February 29th, 2024. Around 65 students from various departments enthusiastically participated in the event. The program featured two sessions: a technical

lecture session and a practical training session.

Dr. Bendangnaro Jamir, Co-ordinator, Green club and Assistant Professor in the Department of Botany. She highlighted that the training program was just a small step towards living a sustainable life and encouraged the students to learn and apply in their daily life. Dr. Magdelene Kiewhuo, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Zoology at SJU, served as the guest speaker, providing insights into the agricultural benefits of vermicompost and delving into the classifications, morphology, and life cycle of earthworms. During the presentation, she outlined the various earthworm species utilized in vermiculture, their dietary requirements, and the importance of earthworm rearing and also emphasizing on the entrepreneurial opportunities associated with vermin composting.



ONE DAY HANDS ON TRAINING PROGRAMME "RECENT TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS ON CULTIVATION AND COMMERCIALIZATION OF EDIBLE MUSHROOMS"



Department of Botany, Chumoukedima, Nagaland organised a one-day hands on training programme entitled "Recent Technological Developments on Cultivation and Commercialization of Edible Mushrooms" on 12th February, 2024. Students, research scholars and faculties from various departments attended the program.

The guest speaker Dr. Sosang Longkumer, Director, Konger Agritech (OPC) Private Ltd, Aoyimkum, Village, Dimapur, Nagaland explained the importance of Shitake, Oyster, Button, Milky mushrooms farming, and also discussed on its nutritional value, cultivation process, economical and health benefits aspects and the increasing demand of mushroom as foods in the markets of Nagaland, other states of India and in the global world. Session concluded successfully.

Training program on mushroom cultivation:

The second session consisted of hands-on training on mushroom cultivation demonstrated by Dr. K. Kumar, Assistant professor, Department of Botany, assisted by Dr. Amarnath Pandian, Professor, Department of Botany. The participants were trained on the preparation of spawn and bed for cultivating oyster mushroom. The program ended successfully.




DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
