People with varied experiences face the challenge of tragedy and suffering that leads one to think that evil seems to have triumphed and so we are prone to despair. Evil, epitomized on Good Friday could not and will not have the ultimate and the final word. The evil carried out on Good Friday will always be defeated. We are all invited to focus not on Good Friday but on Easter Sunday. Easter is the final word in the battle between good and evil. This is the core message of Easter. Pope Francis in his Urbi et Orbi blessing in 2016 said, “The glorious Easter message, that Jesus, who was crucified is not here but risen.” (Mt 28:5-6), offers us the comforting assurance that the abyss of death has been bridged and, with it, all mourning, lamentation, and pain (Rev 21:4). Our world is full of persons suffering in body and spirit, even as the daily news is full of stories of brutal crimes which often takes place within homes, and large-scale armed conflicts which cause indescribable suffering to people of the world.

The Lord Jesus, our peace (Eph 2:14) by his resurrection triumphed over evil and sin. May he draw us closer on this Easter to the victims of terrorism that blinds and to the brutal form of violence which continues to shed blood in different parts of the world. With weapons of love, God has defeated selfishness and death. His son Jesus is the door of mercy wide open to all. With weapons of love, God has defeated selfishness and death. His son Jesus is the door of mercy open for all. The message of resurrection is one of life for all humanity, echoes down the ages and invites us not to forget those men and women seeking a better future, an ever more numerous throng of migrants and refugees including many children fleeing from violence. In such a context one needs to be reminded of the words of Christ “Take courage: I have conquered the world.” (John 16:33)

To those in our society who have lost all hope and joy in life, to the elderly who struggle alone and feel their strength waning, to young people who seem to have no future, to all I once more address the words of the Risen One: “See I am making all things new ... to the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life” (Rev. 21:5-6). May this comforting message of Jesus help each of us to set out anew with greater courage and greater hope to blaze trails of reconciliation with God and with all our brothers and sisters. Such has been the triumphant reply of people who have experienced the victory of Jesus in the midst of personal suffering and tragedies. When Mr Graham Steins, the Australian Christian Missionary and his two sons were burnt alive in Orissa, on January 23, 1999, his widowed wife and daughter who had to live such a colossal tragedy expressed their faith in the new life and victory of Good, when they sang in the memorial observance: “Because he lives, I can face tomorrow, because he lives, all fear is gone, because I know He holds the future and life is worth living- just because he Lives.”

Message

Dear readers,

I like to share the story of Christopher with you all. Ophelus was a strong boy. His father said to him, "Ophelus, you must serve a greater and stronger master, so that you can use your strength in a right and proper way." So Ophelus left home. He came to a king's court, where a young lad told him that this king was the mightiest far and wide. Ophelus had himself led to the throne, and there he offered his services. Now on that very day the king had summoned all the knights of his country to form an army, because a neighboring king had invaded and burnt down a town. The king intended to send a great force against the invader. When he saw the powerful Ophelus he said, "You have come at the moment of my greatest need. You shall be above all my soldiers, and with you I shall win every battle."



They fought the battle and triumphed over it. But learning that the devil was very powerful he went to serve the devil but could not find. One day he met the devil and joined him but later on OPHERUS realised that the devil feared Christ. "If there is a lord who has power over not only earth but also heaven, then surely he is the greatest king, and him only will I serve," said Ophelus; and the devil left him, cursing. Ophelus stayed on in a chapel. The workmen found Ophelus asleep within the chapel walls. Awakened by their noise, he jumped up, and pointing to the wooden cross asked, "To what king does this sign belong?" They answered, "The king's name is Christ."

He began seeking Christ. He inquired everywhere if anyone had heard of him or knew where he could be found. Ophelus met a hermit, and the hermit advised him: "Listen then to my advice. If you wish to find Christ, you must serve mankind with all your strength. Do you see the broad river down there? It has no bridge, yet every day many wayfarers wish to cross. Go down there, build a hut by the stream, and ferry people over on your strong shoulders. If you do this out of love, you may find what you seek." For many years, Ophelus did as the hermit said. He did not spare himself; day or night he was ready to help the travelers who passed. He built himself a little hut at the edge of the river, and if someone called, he carried them across the dangerous waters. But in all this time, his longing to find Christ grew stronger.

On a stormy night he heard a voice crying, "Ophelus, Ophelus, carry me over." He left his house and searched up and down the riverbank, but found no one. So he returned to his hut and fell asleep again. But the voice called again, coming to him weakly through the tempest: "Ophelus, Ophelus, carry me over." Again he went out, but no one was there. Thinking it must be the wind, he lay down again. But before long he heard the voice a third time. It sounded at first like a cry, and then he heard his name through the wind: "Ophelus, Ophelus, come carry me over the water."

This time he found a small child huddled on the riverbank. He lifted the little boy onto his shoulder, where he seemed quite light; but when he entered the water, the child became increasingly heavier. Soon the burden grew so great that Ophelus almost broke down under its weight. He cried out, "Oh, little child, you seem to be so very heavy – it is as if I were carrying the whole earth on my shoulders." Then the child answered, "You not only carry the earth and the heavens, but you carry him who bears the whole need of the world upon himself. I am Jesus Christ, your King whom you seek." "From now on you will fear neither death nor the devil. You will walk through the suffering of this world and your name will be Christ-Ophelus, which means 'bearer of Christ.' Your soul will be illumined with the love of God, and you will show mercy to men." Then the child disappeared; but Christophorus obeyed his command and went out to the people of the earth. Wherever he went, he witnessed to the love and power of the child, his King.

Let us open our ears, then, so that we too may hear the voice calling us to carry the King over. Let that be our new way of being alive!

Civil Engineering

The event received an overwhelming response from within the university as well as from other institutes, registering a huge number of participants and branding the symposium as a grand success.

The symposium was inaugurated by Er. Zhapulhoulie Rupreo, Principal, Government Polytechnic, Seithekema C, Nagaland who graced the event with his presence as the Special Guest. The event was also graced by several other dignitaries, including Shri D. A. Shishak, Chairman, IEI Nagaland Local Centre as a special guest. The Vice Chancellor, Dr. Gnanadurai, in his presidential address emphasizes the education system where students can learn, apply, innovate and to think out of the box. And he also declared the inaugural of IEI Students' Chapter which is so far the only such chapter in Nagaland wherein Mr. E. Nainar is the Co-ordinator.

Shri D. A. Shishak came as a representative to the IEI, which was also an integral part of the programme. The Institution of Engineers (India) is the largest multi-disciplinary professional body of engineers, established in 1920, with its headquarters located in Kolkata. He exhorted the students by touching on the learning aspects of the educational system. In his speech, D. A. Shishak talked about the important role of civil engineers in developing the world. He urged the students to push for their dreams to build a better world. There were more than 120 participants from various colleges and universities, including Polytechnic. Following the valedictory address delivered by Dr. A. Anthonisan, Registrar-SJU on

teaching and learning process, urged the students to learn conceptually. He also touched on the future career prospects for the students and bid them to be successful and be an asset to Nagaland. The programme concluded with prize distribution to all the winning teams and participants.

Computer Science



The Department of Computer Science association 'TEKNE CLUB', St. Joseph University, Nagaland organised a *Guest lecture programme on Current Trends and Research Challenges in IoT* on April 28th 2022. The programme began with the Inaugural Session, which was hosted by Mangang Konyak, II BCA, and featured Metsivikho Thepa delivering the Welcome Address. Ajay Thapa of I MCA Invoked God's blessing for the success of the program which was followed by a prayer song by the Department Choir. The special address was given by Dr. A. Anthonisan, the Registrar of St. Joseph University who graced this programme with his august presence and spoke about the evolution of computers and networks in particular. He also spoke on how the Internet of Things (IoT) has developed and what impact it will have in the coming decades. Following the Inaugural Session, Mr. Bikramjit Choudhury, Professor of Computer Science and Engineering at the Central Institute of Technology in Kokrajhar, Assam, spoke about how IoT is becoming a critical technology for sustainability in Recent Trends. Few more things, he touched where that platform fever is spreading from the cloud to the edge, Manufacturing is being transformed by IoT initiatives, Cloud Native applications are becoming more popular and accessible, Operations are being transformed by hype automation, Immersive realities (VR/AR) are making inroads into the business world, and 5G is on its way to becoming IoT-ready. On the research front the speaker highlighted about the Privacy and security aspects, data processing, analysis, management, monitoring and sensing, and M2M communication and communication protocols. The students engaged in an animated discussion with the Resource Person after his entrenching talk was over.

The Valedictory Session brought the programme to a close. Dr. S. Pradeep Kumar Kenny delivered a Special Address on the Internet of Things' Challenges and Recent Trends. Loneho Richa of I BCA proposed the vote of thanks.

The Department of Zoology, St Joseph University organized a field trip for the B.Sc second year stu-

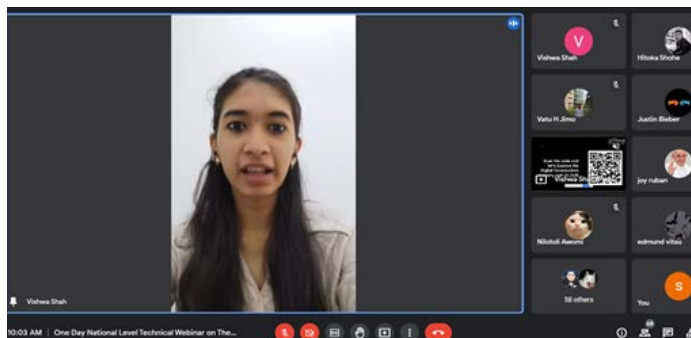

Economics

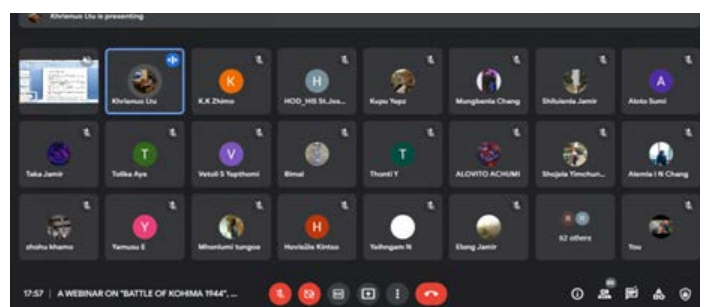

History

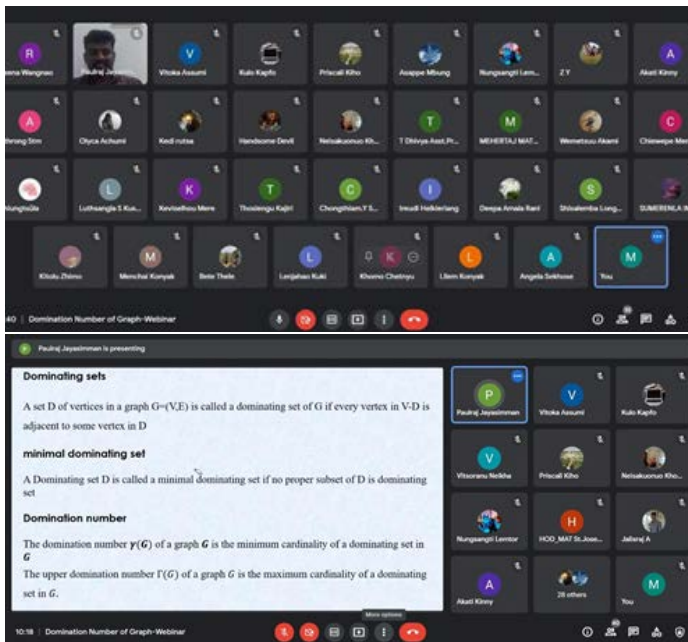
