Course Objectives

- Identify the presence and impact of Portuguese, Dutch, English, and French traders in India.
- Analyze the Carnatic Wars and evaluate the reasons for French failure and Dupleix's role.
- Explain the causes and consequences of Plassey and Buxar, and assess Clive's Dual System.
- Evaluate Hastings' reforms, Anglo-Mysore Wars, Tipu Sultan's policies, Cornwallis' reforms, and Wellesley's alliance.
- Describe the Anglo-Maratha Wars and evaluate the Anglo-Sikh Wars with reasons for Sikh defeat.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course it is intended that a student will be able to:

- Remember the key European trading companies, major battles, treaties, and important personalities in 18th-century India.
- Explain the motives of European traders, the nature of Anglo-French rivalry, and the expansion of British power.
- Apply historical knowledge to interpret the administrative reforms of Warren Hastings, Cornwallis, and Wellesley in the context of colonial consolidation.
- Analyze the causes and consequences of the Carnatic Wars, Anglo-Mysore Wars, Anglo-Maratha Wars, and Anglo-Sikh Wars.
- Critically evaluate the role of individuals like Dupleix, Robert Clive, Tipu Sultan, and Lord Wellesley in shaping India's political history.
- Compare European rivalries and British expansion, linking political, military, and administrative aspects into a unified historical account.

Unit 2- Anglo-French Rivalry in South India(12 Hrs)

First Carnatic Wars (1746-48); Second Carnatic War (1749-54); Third Carnatic War (1758-63); Analysis of French failure; Career and achievements of Dupleix

Unit 3- Expansion of British dominion in India (12 Hrs)

Battle of Plassey (1757) and its importance; Reforms of Mir Qasim; Battle of Buxar (1764): causes, courses and consequences; Treaty of Allahabad (1765); Robert Clive: Dual System of government in Bengal (1765-1772) and effects

Unit 4- Expansion and Consolidation of British Rule in India (12 Hrs).

Warren Hastings (1772-85); Conquest of Mysore: The Anglo- Mysore Wars (1776-1799); Administration of Tipu Sultan; Administrative reforms of Cornwallis (1786–1793); Lord Wellesley (1798-1805): The Subsidiary Alliance

Unit 5- Anglo-Maratha and Anglo-Sikh Wars (12 Hrs)

First Anglo–Maratha War (1775–1782); Second Anglo–Maratha War (1803–1806); Third Anglo–Maratha War (1817–1818); Causes of Maratha defeat; Anglo-Sikh Wars: The First Anglo- Sikh War (1845-1846), Second Anglo- Sikh War (1848-1849)
