Unit 1: Communalism, Partition, and Independence of India(12 Hrs)

The growth of communalism and story of partition and its consequences, role of Muslim league for creation of Pakistan, Cabinet Mission Plan, The Indian Independence Act, 1947, Assassination of MK Gandhi.

Unit 2: Making of the Constitution and Nation-Building(12 Hrs)

Formation of constituent assembly, Role of B.R.Ambedkar and drafting committee, Framing of Indian constitution, and adoption, basic features of Indian constitutions, Liaquat-Nehru pact, The first general election(1951-52).

Unit 3: Nation-Building and Integration(12 Hrs)

The initial years; Process of national consolidation and integration of Indian states: role of Sardar Patel, annexation of Goa, the linguistic reorganization of the states: Dhar commission, JVP committee, Fazl Ali commission.

Unit 4: Post-independence Socio-Economic Developments (12 Hrs)

Hindu code bill, Nehru and the five year plans, Land reforms: Zamindari abolition, Tenancy reforms, Bhoodan movement, The Green revolution and agrarian conflict.

Unit 5:Major Conflicts and Wars Involving India(12 Hrs)

Royal Indian Navy mutiny 1946, Indo- Pak war (the first war of Kashmir 1947-48), Sino-Indian war of 1962, the second round India-Pakistan conflict of 1965, liberation of Bangladesh, 1971.
