Course Objectives

- To introduce the socio-political conditions of China and Japan before Western intervention.
- To examine the impact of Western imperialism on China and Japan.
- To analyze major reforms and revolutions in China.
- To understand the rise of nationalism and communism in China.
- To study Japan's transformation and expansionist policies.
- To evaluate the role of China and Japan in East Asian politics.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course it is intended that a student will be able to:

- Explain the socio-political conditions of China and Japan before Western influence.
- Analyze the impact of the Opium Wars and Western imperialism in China.
- Examine the reform movements and nationalism in China.
- Understand the modernization of Japan after the abolition of the Shogunate.
- Evaluate Japan's expansionist and militaristic policies in East Asia.
- Assess the significance of major international events related to East Asia.

Unit 1 - China and the Coming of Western Imperialism (12 Hrs.)

China prior to arrival of the West: its natural resources, people and socio-cultural and political aspects; early contact with Europe; the Anglo Chinese relations in the 19 th century: the East India Company, the First Opium War: causes, treaty of Nanking and effects of the War; the Second Opium War: causes, course and results; the impact of western powers in China: the Taiping Rebellion: nature, causes, failure and effects.

Unit 2 – China in Transition: Reform, Revolution and Political Transformation (12 Hrs.)

System of particles - Bola, center of mass - drum major's baton, non-uniform rod, conservation of momentum - Three body system, impulse -rubber ball rebound, flow of mass- spacecraft, rocket in free space and gravitational field, momentum transport to the surface.

Unit 3 - Nationalism and Modernization in China and Japan (12 Hrs.)

Nationalism under Koumintang Government and End; the Communist regime in China and transformation; Japan: Feudal character of Japanese Government and abolition of Shogunate; transformation of Japan post Shogunate; Sino-Japanese relations and conflict; causes of Sino- Japanese war (1894-1895).

Unit 4 – Rise of Japan as an Modern Imperial Power (12 Hrs.)

Open Door Policy; Anglo Japanese Alliance; Russo Japanese War 1904; Expansionist policy of Japan in the Far East: Japan in the WW-1; The Washington Conference (1921).

Unit 5 - Militarism, Imperial Expansion and Post-War Occupation of Japan (12 Hrs.)

Party Government in Japan; Manchurian crises and results; extreme militarists and Japanese expansion; occupation of Japan (1945).
