Course Objectives

- This paper aimed to help students comprehend the foundations of the Delhi Sultanate, the Mughal Empires and their contributions, the nature of state, society, religion and economy.
- It will also enable the student to understand Medieval India's political history and to examine the medieval ruler administration.
- To inculcate the important events, administration and establishment of the Muslim rule in India.

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course it is intended that a student will be able to:

- To enable the student to understand political history of Medieval India, the nature of state, economy and society.
- It will also help the student in recognizing the factors which led to the rapid changes of dynasties from the Delhi Sultanate to Mughal Empire.
- To help the student in understanding the difference in State policy between the Sultanate and the Mughal Empire.

Unit 1 - Introduction to Medieval History (12 Hrs.)

Sources of Medieval India: Literary and Archaeological Sources, Muhammad Ghori and its aftermath, Slave dynasty (1206-1290): Qutbuddin Aibak: Iltutmish: Razia Sultan: Balban.

Unit 2 – The period of Revolution (12 Hrs.)

Khilji dynasty (1290-1320): Jalaluddin Khilji: Alauddin Khilji- Administration, Market Regulation: The Mongol invasion, Downfall of Khilji dynasty.

Unit 3 - Disintegration of the Delhi Sultanat (12 Hrs.)

Tughlaq dynasty (1320-1414): Ghiyasuddin: Mohammad bin Tughlaq- his experiments, Firoz shah Tughlaq; the Sayyid Rulers (1414-1451); The Lodhis (1451- 1526)- Bahlol Lodhi, Sikandar Lodhi, Ibrahim Lodhi.

Unit 4 – Foundation of Mughal Empire (12 Hrs.)

Babur (1526-30): Humayun (1530-56): Sher Shah's career and achievements, revenue and administrative reforms; Akbar the Great (1556-1605): Conquests, Revenue Administration, Religious Policy.

Unit 5 - Consolidation of the Mughal Empire (12 Hrs.)

Jahangir (1605-1627); Shah Jahan: Golden age of Mughal History, Deccan Policy (1628-1658); Aurangzeb: Religious policy, Deccan Policy (1658-1707); War with Marathas; Shivaji and the Mughals; Decline and disintegration of Mughal Empire.
