Nature of the colonial state in India; Constitutional developments under British rule; The Revolt of 1857 and its significance

### Unit III: Social Change and the Rise of National Consciousness (13 hrs)

Major social and religious reform movements; Spread of education in colonial India; Rise of the new middle class

### Unit IV: Phases of the Nationalist Movement (13 hrs)

Early nationalist politics and liberal constitutionalists; Swadeshi movement and radical nationalism; All-India Muslim League and the expansion of nationalism

### Unit V: Mass Movements and Partition (12 hrs)

Non-cooperation and civil disobedience movements; Quit India movement and the final phase of the freedom struggle; Two-Nation theory and the partition of India
