- Implementation of community projects: awareness drives/organising events, documentation of field activities.
- Reflection and reporting: Report writing and presentation, field diary maintenance

By the end of this practical course, students will be able to apply the principles of community engagement in real-life settings by conducting community mapping and needs assessments using participatory methods, designing and implementing context-specific community-based projects, and collaborating effectively with local stakeholders and institutions.
